

Claim of Immunity to Extradition

This is the Claim of Immunity of _____,
sworn on the _____ day of _____, 20____, and served to the sitting Minister of Justice
and Attorney General of Canada on the _____ day of _____, 20__.

Where as The Extradition Act does state in Section 6.1 the following:

No immunity

6.1 Despite any other Act or law, no person who is the subject of a request for surrender by the International Criminal Court or by any international criminal tribunal that is established by resolution of the Security Council of the United Nations and whose name appears in the schedule, may claim immunity under common law or by statute from arrest or extradition under this Act.

And, whereas a name resembling mine does not appear in the schedule mentioned, nor am I the subject of a request for surrender by the International Criminal Court or any international tribunal, and,

Whereas I am aware the people employed by the government of Canada have in the case of Marc Emery failed to fully inform him of his rights, and,

Whereas I do not wish to end up like Marc Emery,

Therefore be it now known to any and all concerned or affected parties, that I, _____

do hereby clearly, specifically and unequivocally claim that I am immune from extradition and arrest under the Extradition Act and I do not consent to anyone surrendering my self or my property to any other party, group, agency, government, or organization.
